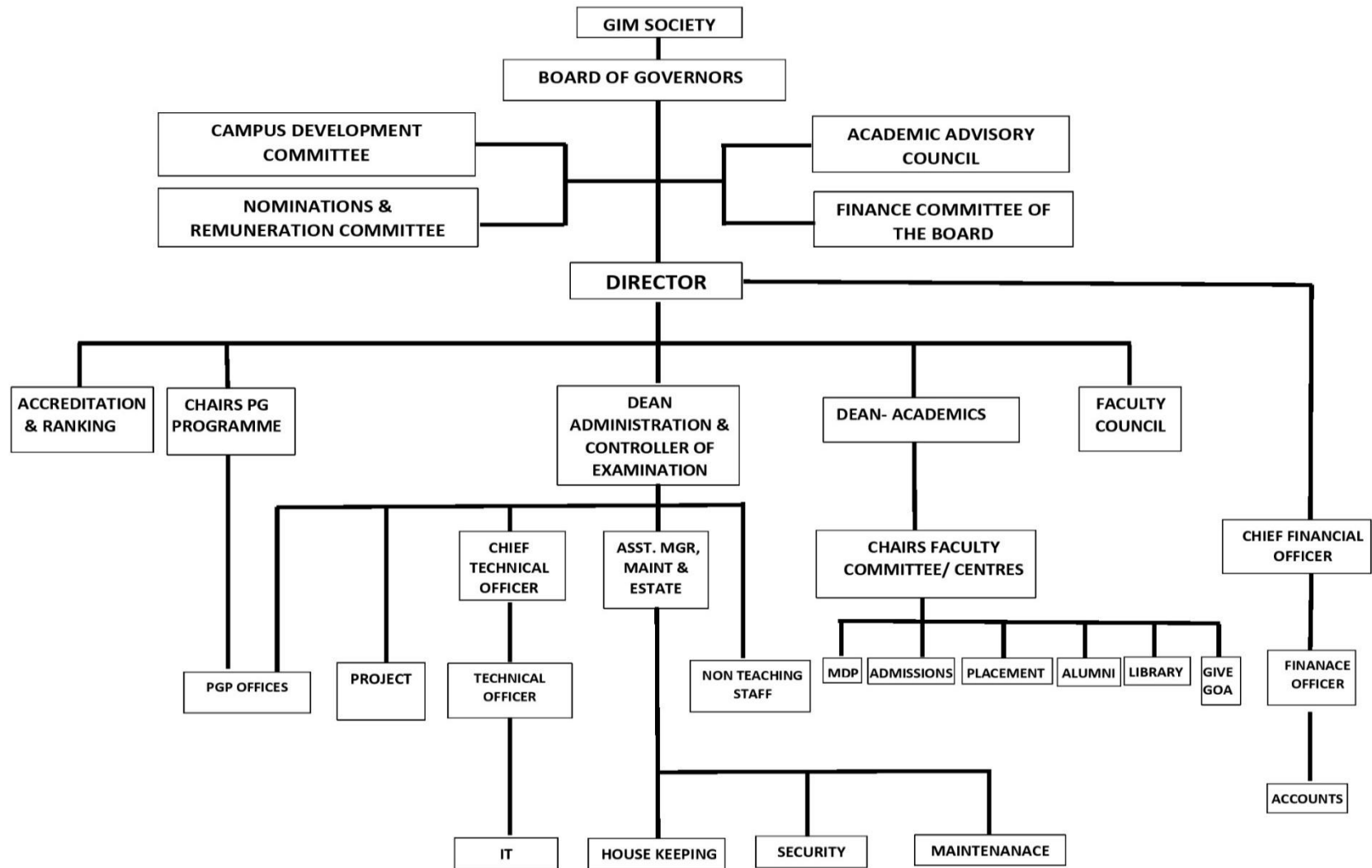

It's an event in which participants debate/banter about two opposing topics by being Gobaal and thus no real facts are used.

Counterclock'22: In this magnificent voyage of GIM, an hourglass of 2.5ft was built to indicate the "time remaining" for the outgoing batch. Alongside the counter clock were red and black blocks indicating the number of days left.

Leave your mark: A white leafless tree was painted on black background for the senior batch to leave their mark on. The final year students left their marks on this tree in the form of colourful fingerprints. These prints completed the tree and transformed a black and white painting into a vibrant image of a tree with colourful leaves signifying the rich diversity of the students at GIM and the different directions they will be going in.

Batch T-shirts- Kshitiz exclusively designed batch T-shirts for the outgoing class of 2022. The black coloured T-shirts were specifically designed for the final year students. Students wearing these T-shirts stood together to form the Letters of GIM and the photographs of the same were clicked and shared widely on social media platforms.

Yearbook- Kshitiz exclusively created yearbooks for the students of the batch 2020-22. These books consisted of club pictures, student testimonials, student photographs, DOB and phone number of each student. Kshitiz's

yearbook helps the graduating batch live the two most amazing years of their lives forever and stay connected. The hard copy of the yearbook was distributed to the whole batch.

- **PARIGYAN – THE DATA SCIENCE SOCIETY OF GIM**

Buzzcafe (Panel Discussion): We successfully organized and concluded buzzcafe in collaboration with Samriddhi (The business Symposium and annual flagship event of GIM) where we had invited three prominent speakers from the industry in order to spread awareness on data science and familiarize the students of GIM with various aspects related to it from the industry experts themselves.

Data Scavenger: A social media series called “the Data Scavenger” had been initiated which showcased a brief review on how various organizations are leveraging data in order to make better and data driven decisions today. The engagement has been overwhelming to the same and has been taken well by the users.

Podcast: We have been successful in concluding and releasing the first podcast among all the clubs and societies currently present. Our podcast called the “From the Non-Striker's End” aims to enlighten our listeners about the intricacies of the world of data science through our industry experts who are accomplished in their respective domains. We had the honor of collaborating with the well-established youtuber and co-founder of iNeuron, Mr. Krish Naik for the same and successfully released our interaction with him via Spotify.

Article: We wrote a monthly article related to the current trends and influence in the Data Science and analytics world and released three such articles in the span of last 6 months.

Coalesce 2022: We successfully concluded our annual flagship event Coalesce '22. The event comprised of two speaker talks by two leading industry experts and a panel discussion for which we invited a team of four distinguished panellists. In addition to the above events, we also conducted PRATYAKSH - The national level Data Visualisation competition. We were able to attract an overwhelming engagement of more than 600 participations for the competition and the data talks from both GIM and other leading colleges such as XLRI, FMS Delhi, IIMs and Symbiosis.

- **SAMARTHAN**

GiveGoa (October 2021 – March 2022) – Samarthan worked closely with management, GiveGoa Chairman Prof. Vithal Sukhthankar and Ashely Furtado Sir, to effectively coordinate and manage all the activities under the GiveGoa initiative. GiveGoa initiative is to promote social responsibility among the students of GIM through service to the less privileged communities and thereby contribute to goal of a more inclusive society. This activity began in October 2021 and lasted till end of third trimester i.e., March 2022. Under this activity, we had to ensure smooth functioning and hassle-free travel experience for 40 GiveGoa groups. This also included timely collection of reports, client details and other student deliverables.

Daan Utsav - Wild Goose Chase (8th October 2021) - Samarthan organised its first event Wild Goose Chase on 8th October, 2021. It was a fun filled event where participating teams had to run around the campus completing various tasks such as clicking selfies and singing songs. The proceeds from the event were donated to Saurab Kammar, a social worker from Karnataka who helps stray, injured and in distress animals and birds. He runs a small rehabilitation centre for these animals and birds.

Melior (10th December 2021) – Samarthan along with Mecca – the Marketing Club, organized Melior – a national level case study competition in collaboration with Samriddhi – the Flagship event of GIM.

Participation in UNPRME (10th December 2021) – UNPRME India chapter event was conducted on 10th December 2021. The event comprised of various online activities such as Panel Discussion, Discussion on

Positive Impact Rating, Students for PRME: Learning to build inclusive futures, etc. 3 students from Samarthan had participated in this event and represented GIM.

- The face-to-face workshop on "How to review research manuscript?" by Prof. Allan Bird is conducted on the 17th and 24th of September for GIM faculties.
- Internal research seminar face to face resumed.
- Research data and reports related to ACSSB, NBA accreditation and other ranking sources were collated and given to respective offices.
- Renewal of existing databases and procurement of new databases/software like CMIE Consumer Pyramid, NVIVO, STATA, Grammarly etc.
- An online Workshop on 'Research Grant Proposal Writing' was conducted by Prof. Dibyendu Mait, Professor Delhi School of Economics, for GIM faculties.

- Dr Naureen Bhullar from IIM Bangalore was invited for a seminar titled "What is ethics in research and why it is important?" for GIM faculties and research scholars.
- A new Twitter handle for GIM Research (<https://twitter.com/GimResearch>) was created. The idea is to publicize our GIM research to our alumni, students, internal and external academicians etc. This will showcase the institute's work and that of individual faculty members. As a result, it is an avenue for faculty to be approached by researchers for collaboration, industry for projects/ consultancy, and organizations in an advisory/ consultant capacity. Every week 2, 3 tweets related to the latest GIM research are published. The tweets are written in an understandable and layman's language for a broader audience. The initial responses are encouraging.

The data will help CER in organizing future workshops and seminars. It will also help reflect the current conference and research funds policies.

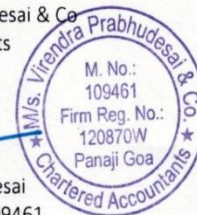

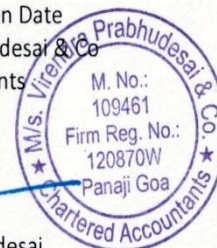

20. BEST PRACTICES ADOPTED

CENTERS OF EXCELLENCE AT GIM:

CENTRE OF SOCIAL SENSITIVITY AND ACTION (CSSA).

Goa Institute of Management's (GIM), Centre for Social Sensitivity and Action (CSSA), established in 2013 is a centre to promote social responsibility within and outside GIM and acts as a bridge between the leading B-school and the external community which we are a part of. Apart from the different Institutions to which CSSA remains committed to are, the UN Sustainable Development Goals, Principles for Responsible Management Education (PRME) initiative and to the promotion of responsible management on Climate Change, through education, research, policy analysis, and global cooperation.

GIM is a member of United Nations Global Compact (UNGC), part of a network of companies across the world who work towards the Global Compact's mission of "Committing to sustainability and shared responsibility for achieving a better world".

The aim of CSSA at GIM is to promote social responsibility within and beyond its campus to achieve the goals of Agenda 2030, which also aligns well with the vision of many B-Schools globally. CSSA is becoming a recognized Centre not just in Asia, but has spread over to the Seven Seas and beyond where academics, scholars, researchers and practitioners come together to create sustainable and inclusive approaches thus creating several productive relationships Internationally with the best institutions in advancing the SDGs."

CSSA has collaborated with international and National platforms e.g. Alpha Zulu Advocates, AIM2Flourish, The Living Heritage Foundation, Commitments Accelerator for Plastic Pollution (CAPP), Ocean Recovery Alliance (ORA) and Indian Plastic Institute (IPI) and other national/local organisations e.g. Goa Chamber of Commerce and Industry Education Committee, Goa Livelihood Forum etc to reach out to the community.

CSSA stand with the Mission of Goa Institute of Management into creating knowledge & nurturing leaders for sustainable businesses and an inclusive society for India and the World while maintaining a strong & ongoing commitment to Goa

The flagship event of CSSA in this calendar year was a Virtual Colloquium on Driving Agenda 2030: Research for Societal and Business Sustainability on 18 and 20 November 2021. The purpose of the colloquium was to provide a platform to researchers to-

- Highlight their research on SDGs
- Explore collaborations for new research initiatives on SDGs
- Interact with experts on sustainability and SDGs

The inaugural session had a special section of virtual messages by two eminent members in the area of higher education. Prof. Stephanie Bryant, Executive Vice President and Global Chief Accreditation Officer, the other special virtual message was shared by Prof. Brad Blitz, who is globally known as migration expert and served as Director British Academy Modern Slavery Project 2017 to 2019. He is a Professor at the University of California and Distinguished Professor at GIM.

The first session of the colloquium had four presentations by national and international doctoral students and faculty members working on the areas of Sustainable Development and management. This session announced one best paper award.

The Second Session was a panel discussion and was jointly hosted by GIM and North-South University, Dhaka on Research and Consulting opportunities in the area of Sustainable Development. The session was divided into the three following dimensions.

- Importance of Research on SDGs
- New Research Areas in SDGs
- Funding Opportunities in SDG Research

The third session was Panel Discussion on Driving 2030 Agenda through Impact Research and was jointly Co-hosted by UNPRME, India Chapter. The discussion opened with an open slate questioning the importance of impact research and achieving sustainable development goals in business world. It steered up an interesting conversation among the panelist. Another question raised was “What are the drivers or motivating factors that would help researchers integrate sustainable development goals into their research?”

The closing session was a Fire-side Chat with the Editors from Journal of Management Education. The Editors briefed the participants on the history, objectives of Journal of Management Education. They also mentioned that one of the core objectives of JME is to promote the physical and psychological well-being of instructors and students alike through management research. They also spoke about the sister journals of JME, the detailed history of JME and what makes JME different from that of other journals by explaining about author and instructor considerations at JME. The session provided detailed insights into JME and its close alignment with UN SDGs.

As a token of gratitude, and on behalf of CSSA and GIM, the dignitaries were honoured with a grove of 10 trees planted at Trees for Ganga, Bhagalpur, Bihar - India.

Overall the virtual colloquium came forward as a timely reminder towards the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) 2030, and their targets for global development, which is set to be achieved in the 2030 Agenda. The virtual colloquium, offered variety of sessions with academic rigor and practical implications made in the directions towards achieving SDGs 2030.

The Colloquium witnessed participants from various countries e.g. India, Bangladesh, Hong Kong, UK, USA, Australia, and Portugal. Participants were research scholars, early career researchers/ faculty from business schools and other colleges, and some industry and NGO representatives.

Down Memory Lane: 10 years’ Journey of GiveGoa

CSSA undertook the task of putting together Down Memory Lane: 10 years’ Journey of GiveGoa, a hand book that put together achievement by Students, Faculty Members and stake holder and all their accomplishments during its journey that started in the 2011, where in GIM felt compelled to address these concerns by crafting a course which will help make next generation of managers ethical and socially responsible.

GiveGoa was launched by Professor. Ranjini Swamy along with her team Dr. Aishi Sengupta, Ms. Rashmi Shetkar, Dr. Divya Singhal with support of the then Director Mr P.F.X Dlima. Professor Ranjini Swamy was the backbone behind the planning of the GiveGoa program. The first GiveGoa visit happened on 21 July 2011 making the class of 2011-2013 as the pioneer batch of Give Goa. In the first year a total of 53 projects were offered to 40 student groups.

The purpose of GiveGoa is to promote social responsibility among the students of GIM through services to the under privileged communities and by contributing towards making society more inclusive the projects are done for a year, where the students visit the field, interact with the beneficiaries, understand the context and then start working on the project. All the projects of GiveGoa seek to improve the lives of the local community of Goa. The

uniqueness of the projects lies in providing the students of GIM, an opportunity to participate in immersive learning.

GiveGoa aims at holistic development of the students, develop systems thinking and help them change their overall attitude towards life and the prevalent social realities.

The purpose of the GiveGoa is to help students become more socially aware and inclined towards taking responsibility for the community welfare. The course enables students to:

- describe “real-world” problems and circumstances faced by the community
- apply their managerial acumen to solve community problems and improve lives of the community
 - realize the need for (and feel inclined towards) addressing problems of the community

Since its inception, GiveGoa has cautiously chosen a diverse set of projects ranging from education, agriculture, environmental protection, health to awareness regarding various government schemes; to expose students to myriad societal challenges. All the projects have given the students an opportunity to serve the Goan community at the grassroots level.

- **Management Development Program for Program Managers of Goa Livelihood Forum (GLF) Nurturing Leaders for Social Impact**

A 4 -day training program was organized by CSSA in Collaboration with Goa Livelihood Forum on Nurturing Leader for Social Impact, the aim of this training session was to help develop advanced skills and a systems mindset among participants, which will help them lead and drive positive impact at the level of organization and the community. the sessions were led by CSSA Chairperson and Faculty Member Prof Divya and Prof Sreerupa along with Prof Karman and Prof Padmavati.

- Learn techniques to enhance your style of leadership

Session 2: Art of Communication (Presentation and social media communication)

- Acquire skills to improve your style of presentation

- **AIC-GIM ESG Start-up WEEK Celebrations**

CSSA organized three events in collaboration with AIC-GIM in October month to contribute to creating an ecosystem for sustainability and social impact.
- ❖ The first event was a Social Impact Photography Challenge on Instagram held in October 2021 as part of ESG Start-up WEEK by AIC-GIM and Climate Collective. The aim of the Social Impact/Social Issue Photography Challenge was to raise awareness on social issues. The photos submitted were addressed/related to below listed SDGs and issues related to these: SDG 1 (No Poverty), SDG 2 (Zero Hunger), SDG 3(Good health and well-being), SDG 4 (Quality

Education), and SDG 5 (Gender Equality), SDG 10 (Reducing Inequalities) or SDG 16 (Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions). The response received was good and winners were awarded certificates by AIC-GIM and CSSA.

- ❖ The second event was a virtual session on Circularity on 6 October 2021. Prof. Sreerupa Sengupta moderated the conversation with Ms. Shalini Goyal Bhalla, Council Circular, on Circularity, ESG, and Sustainable Development.
- ❖ The third event was a collaborative webinar on 19th October 2021 on "ESG: Corporate to Classroom" by Ram Kolavennu, Ex-COO Labour Net and COO, Foundation for Excellence. Goa Chamber of Commerce and Industry Education Committee has also co-hosted this event. The session was found useful by attendees from start-ups, industry, and academia.
- **Sustainability Tweet – A – Thon.**
CSSA at GIM has always been committed to equity, inclusivity, and sustainability through its SDGs, based on which the Tweet – A – Thon August Month on Sustainable Business challenge was organised along with the SC, ST, and DI Committee.

The Decade of Action called by the UN, attempted to accelerate and spread the awareness on the SDGs and 2030 Agenda. The activity that was spread across four weeks, had the following 4 specific themes for each week on which students had to tweet.

-  Decent Work with the hashtag #Act4DecentWork
-  Inclusion with the hashtag #Act4Inclusion
-  Empathy with the hashtag #Act4Empathy
-  Diversity with the hashtag #Act4Diversity

A total of 17 students registered for the event and tweeted actively for the campaign. Objectives of the tweet-a-thon organized by CSSA are as

- To sensitize and create awareness among students on the four chosen themes.
- To encourage the students to see business as a force for good.
- To urge the students to act responsibly and promote a sustainability mindset.
- Highlight the importance of sustainability practices in their daily activities.

At the end of each week theme – wise winners were announced and at the end of the event the overall winners. All the winners were given Certificates.

Many students shared in their feedback that they found it very informative and exciting as they learnt a lot more about the themes and their importance in the workplace. Many also mentioned that Tweet-a-thon was a great platform to learn about practices around the chosen themes.

The objective of organizing the Tweet-a-thon was to create awareness and to instill in students the importance of SDGs in their daily lives as well as at their workplaces.

At the end, the event successfully achieved these objectives so the students, as well as the audience could learn and can try executing these frameworks and practices in their workplaces and their daily lives.

Collaborations

- **AIM2Flourish:** In our last update, we shared that CSSA is collaborating with AIM2Flourish, the world's first higher-education curriculum incorporating SDGs and "Business as an Agent of World Benefit" as part of Social Responsibility and Action (SRA). The team that won the 2021 Flourish Prize for Global Goal #8: Decent Work

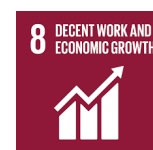
and Economic Growth for their story on Jaipur Rugs was awarded in a virtual global forum held in October 2021. In the last 6 months, 48 new AIM2Flourish stories related to various SDGs highlighting business innovation have already been published. Other stories are under review and will be published soon.

- **Make the Case – Season 2**– In our last update, we shared that CSSA has again collaborated with Commitments Accelerator for Plastic Pollution (CAPP), Ocean Recovery Alliance (ORA), and Indian Plastic Institute (IPI) to launch “Make-a-Case – Season 2” Competition for Students in B Schools/Technical and Scientific Institutes/ Universities in India to identify and showcase high impact plastic waste reduction initiatives in India, so far, over 100 teams have registered for the competition. Reviewers from GIM, IPI and CAPP have evaluated the case studies submitted by the teams. Five shortlisted teams have been informed on 23rd March 2022. Final presentations will take place in the Month of April 2022.
- **Engagement with NGOs for creating Social Impact:** CSSA in association with The Systems and Consulting Club, GIM with support from CSRN, UK provided opportunities to students to participate in pro bono consulting projects on social impact. CSRN is a UK based network (<https://csrn.org.uk/>) and was launched in 2020. It provides connects students to national level NGOs and gives them an opportunity to apply management acumen to social impact projects in the development sectors. 3 student groups from GIM (with 3 students in each group) worked on social impact projects with reputed national level NGOs of India - HumanQind, Ekal Yuva and Why Waste. These projects began end July and ended in September 2021.
- **Ultimate Global Podcast, Australia:** CSSA collaborated with Ultimate Global Podcast to launch joint conversations around the SDGs, ESG reporting, Business & Human Rights, Equity, Inclusion, and Compassion. The first Podcast was live-streamed on 4 October and the theme of the Podcast was ‘Act for SDGs’. Prof. Sreerupa Sengupta represented the CSSA. The second Podcast was on 1 November 2021 on ‘Creating Impact’ and Mr. Sameer Joshi Honorary Treasurer Governing Council of Indian Plastic Institute was the speaker.
- CSSA continues to support Delhi Govt’s largest mentorship program for the students studying in Delhi Government Schools. – **Desh Ka Mentor**, program by coordinating with GIM students who have volunteered to be part of empowering youth studying in Delhi Government schools. Currently, 12 students from GIM have been mentoring students assigned to them virtually. The feedback received from GIM students is very encouraging as they feel that this mentoring opportunity has given to contribute to underprivileged section of society.

CENTRE FOR PUBLIC POLICY & GOVERNANCE (CPPG)

1. The centre was initiated in early June 2021. In initiating the centre, a process of consultations with faculty was undertaken by the Chair designate.
2. Through the process of consultation, the interests of the faculty were gauged and a sense of how the centre should go forward was inferred.
3. A gist of the findings are summarized below:
 - A wide mandate was suggested but to start with the areas where the GIM would already have credibility was suggested. This being health care the Health Care Group either as part of the CPPG or independently would be an important component of the public policy related activities at GIM. Other areas of interest that could be pursued were -
 - The Goa economy and society, regional development
 - Infrastructure and regulation
 - Labour, employment and working conditions
 - Local government and governance
 - It was recognized that in the long term GIM ought to create an area in “Public Management and Policy” along with the centre -CPPG. This would enable the recruitment of faculty who would have a commitment to public policy issues, and would be publishing in the that area as part of their professional requirements.
 - Meanwhile the CPPG should operate as a service centre for activities related to PP and Governance
 - Recruitment of two senior associates be taken up.
 - The CPPG should on priority organize seminars and workshops in the chosen areas
 - The CPPG should initiate the process of starting a journal in the area of public policy.
4. Based on these findings two Senior Research Associates were recruited to the centre and they joined in December 2021: Ms. Bernice de Souza and Mr. K. Chandra Shekar.
5. Prof. Kingsuk Sarkar initiated a conference on the Employment and Indian Labour. This is scheduled on May 10-11. Over 200 proposals were received, and it is expected that about 100 papers would be finally received. We are in the process of shortlisting the papers for presentation. Nearly all the leading scholars in the area, besides research scholars have shown an interest in the conference. Publication of the Conference proceeding is planned.

As decided by the Director, the conference would be held at the Sanquelim Campus of GIM. The conference is expected to result in the CPPG being part of the network of scholars and policy makers working on issues related to labour, employment, working conditions etc.

6. A brainstorming workshop and a seminar on “Issues in Indian Infrastructure” has been initiated. The concept notes to be submitted to Routledge for publication of a Handbook on Infrastructure, to be edited by Profs. Keshab Das and Sebastian Morris has been developed. With the brain storming session, the chapter wise details would be finalized.
7. To steer the Goa - Economy & Society Seminar, a ‘Goa Development Group’ has been formed at the CPPG consisting of Ms. Bernice as the coordinating anchor, and several GIM faculty as members of the core group. The core group would be expanded to include eminent and active persons (scholars/ journalists/ policy makers/ industrialists). The idea is to work on issues of interest to Goa – economic, social, fiscal, administrative, public service delivery, developmental etc, and to bring out a thematic volume annually (with the initial themes being around tourism, manufacturing, multimodal transportation etc.). For every volume meetings and brainstorming sessions are planned and a suitable publisher would have to be identified. If the same can be regular, it will be a core resource on the local economy and society and would be of use to policy makers and industry associations. It is hoped that a corpus funding would in due course be available from the Govt / Industry Associations in Goa to enable the Group to cover the issues in a more detailed and policy-oriented way. The Seminar is planned to be held in about a year.
8. Profs. Avik Sinha and Sebastian Morris are coordinating the efforts to start a journal. The preliminary work of developing a concept note has been done and the proposal for a suitable publisher is being developed. Simultaneously the identification of potential scholars/ policy makers to be on the editorial board is also underway. It is hoped that the same would have the formal approval of the director and the funding to support the same for 4/5 years would be available.
9. The centre had submitted a proposal to the Goa Chamber of Commerce & Industry / the Govt. of Goa for a “Survey Based Study of the Perceived Impact of Mining Activities and their Closure, and Attitudes and Opinions with Regard to Mining, including Reopening of Mines in Goa”. Acceptance of the same for further pursuance is still awaited from the organisation.
10. The centre had also submitted a proposal to the Office of the State Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities, Government of Goa to undertake a study of the existing disability schemes in the state with a view to make recommendations and possibly propose new schemes. Response from the Commission on the same is still awaited.
11. The Centre is also currently working on a proposal to the Dept. of Personnel Training to get listed as one of the Institutions to provide training to IAS and other civil service officers. Concept notes on the following MDPs have been received - Capability building program on Gender Sensitization, Redressal and Grievance Management (Prof. Anamika Sinha) and Introduction of four new labour codes: Implications for labour regulation (Prof. Kingshuk Sarkar). MDPs from other faculty members are being prepared. Preparations to submit the proposal are underway and have been entrusted to Ms. Bernice.
12. The Centre also submitted a proposal to the Corporation of the City of Panaji (CCP) to study it’s working.
13. The Centre is also working towards finalizing its Brochure which can be utilised for conferences, seminars and other events. Mr. K. Chandra Shekar is in-charge of the same.
14. Documentation of some of the members’ activities and publications.

THE CENTRE FOR CREATIVITY, INNOVATION AND DESIGN-THINKING (CCID):

Akshay Khanna is a Social Anthropologist with training, expertise and experience in the Anthropology of Gender and Sexuality, Political Anthropology, Anthropology of Law, Medical Anthropology, Social and Political Theory and Philosophy, Queer theory, Anthropology of Development, Research Methods and Design, Community Theatre, Reflective Writing and Digital Sociology.
- Students have also been creating posters for the POSH committee which will be printed and displayed on the administrative and hostel buildings.

CENTRE FOR EXCELLENCE IN SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT (CESD)

CESD focuses on the environment related Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and contributes to the following:

- **SDG6- Clean Water and Sanitation**
- **SDG7- Affordable and Clean Energy**
- **SDG11- Sustainable Cities and Communities**
- **SDG12- Responsible Consumption and Production**
 - **SDG13- Climate action**

Activities of CESD for the AY 2021-22

The activities of CESD over the academic year 2021-22 can be divided into four categories:

1 Environmental Sustainability at GIM

One of the proposed agendas of CESD at the time of its inception was to develop GIM as a living lab and work on three aspects- making GIM more sustainable, helping the students, faculty and staff at GIM adopt sustainable lifestyles and documenting these processes. Keeping this in mind, several initiatives as described below were undertaken.

1.1 “No more use-and-throw at GIM” campaign:

The “No more use-and-throw” campaign was conceptualized and launched by CESD to reduce the use of disposable use-and-throw items on the Campus. The first step in this campaign was to reduce the use of paper cups at various points of consumption, by switching to more sustainable, reusable alternatives. This campaign has resulted in saving close to 5500 paper cups from going to the landfill till date and around 96000 cups in a year.

1.2 E-waste management at GIM

1.2.1 Tying up with authorized recyclers for safe disposal of E-waste

The E-waste management rules 2016 notified by the Government of India specify that electronic and electrical waste should be treated scientifically through authorized recyclers. CESD prepared a comprehensive proposal for streamlining E-waste management on the GIM campus.

Thereafter, the Institute has tied up with two authorized e-waste recycling agencies in the State for safe and scientific disposal of the e-waste generated on the campus, thereby complying with the requirements of the E-waste management rules 2016.

1.2.2 E-waste collection drive

CESD in collaboration with the student group under a GiveGoa project conducted an E-waste drive at the Institute for faculty, staff and students from 17th – 22nd March 2022. Designated boxes were kept in student hostels, faculty housing and the academic area for deposition of E-waste. Around 20 kg of E-waste was collected in this phase, and CESD plans to repeat such drives at regular frequencies.

1.3 Documentation of GIM sustainable Campus Development initiatives

The CESD has been working on documenting the efforts at GIM towards sustainability on three aspects: energy management, water management and waste management. The case studies on energy and water management are ready for submission, while that on waste management is in progress.

1.4 Study of waste management practices in Higher Education Institutions

A group of six students under the GiveGoa initiative worked with CESD for improving circularity on the campus w.r.t waste management including identification of current consumption patterns and finding alternatives to disposables, etc. However, since the project had to be switched to the online mode due to the Covid-19 restrictions, the group moved on to study waste management practices from 30 HEIs, including 18 Indian and 12 international institutions. A standard template including about 12 parameters was used to study the practices by referring to secondary data such as reports, blogs, articles on the website, etc.

1.5 Selection of Sustainability Ambassadors

CESD had given out a call to the students to onboard a group of 8-10 highly motivated "Sustainability Ambassadors", who would help the Centre to expand its activities in the coming years by taking up activities like organizing lectures and activities to create awareness amongst students, organizing events like sustainability hackathon, webinars, workshops, managing the social media for the CESD, etc. The team would closely work with CESD over their 2-year tenure at GIM. The Ambassadors have been managing the CESD social media handles and are also contributing to the CESD newsletter.

2 Stakeholder interactions

2.1 Coffee Table book on floral biodiversity

A project was undertaken by the CESD in collaboration with Goa State Biodiversity Board (GSBB) in AY 2020-21, where close to 150 plant species found on the campus were photo documented. Following this, the CESD was entrusted with the task of converting the floral biodiversity register into a coffee table book. The data for the book was collected during the period from April'21 to December'21 through a professional photoshoot. The book was completely conceptualized by the CESD. All images in this book were taken on the GIM campus.

The aim of the book is to bring in sensitivity and appreciation about the floral diversity among the GIM community and will help in conserving and better managing this rich heritage in the coming years.

2.2 Faunal Biodiversity Register

After successful completion of the first phase of the campus biodiversity register that photo documented floral species found on the GIM campus, the CESD has taken up the next project "Biodiversity Register of GIM Campus: Major Fauna". The proposed project plans to document fauna on the Campus including birds, butterflies, reptiles, insects, other animals in a phased manner. The project shall be taken up in a crowd-sourced manner to collate information from various campus occupants, including faculty, staff and students.

Since GIM does not have in-house expertise in faunal documentation and identification, the Institute has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Goa State Biodiversity Board (GSBB) for documentation of the faunal diversity.

The output of this project shall include a Faunal Biodiversity report in addition to flyers/ pamphlets that shall help to increase awareness about the rich biodiversity heritage of the area.

2.3 Sustainability Reporting at GIM

CESD is working on creating a Sustainability Report for GIM. This report will showcase both social, environmental and governance initiatives at GIM, enabling the institute to participate in sustainability linked rankings. A review of the existing relevant frameworks was done to arrive at a structure for the sustainability report for GIM. A four-member team including Prof. Arpita Amarnani, Prof. Shiv Nath Sinha, Prof. Ajay Vamadevan and Apoorva Apte has been formed to work on the project and the team is in the process of collecting and collating the needed information. The environment and governance sections of the report are almost complete and the social section is being worked upon. The Report is expected to be completed very early in the coming academic year.

2.4 "Sustainability Horizon" newsletter

Sustainability Horizon, a quarterly newsletter by CESD collates contributions from students, academicians, and practitioners in the field of environmental sustainability and attempts to address the changing dynamism in the sector. Practitioner's interviews conducted as a part of the newsletter ensure that it addresses the key topics in the domain of environmental sustainability. It was formally introduced on January 13, 2021, on the eve of the National Geographic Society Formation Day. The Newsletter successfully completed one year in December 2021 and the themes for the further four issues of the newsletter were chosen to be relevant to the SDGs set out by the UN.

3 International Activities

3.1 RISE project

CESD worked an international project, Responsibility and Innovation via Social and sustainable Entrepreneurship (RISE) funded by Finnish National Agency, EDUFI. The objective of this Project is to co-develop a curriculum for partner Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) for capacity building in the field of social and sustainable entrepreneurship. The Project aims to identify specific training and capacity building needs in this field in the partnering countries. Rise project is led by LAB University of Applied Sciences (LAB UAS), Finland and the partnering institutions are from Finland, Denmark, Belgium and India.

Under the project, Prof. Arpita and Prof. Sukhathankar from CESD visited Finland in February 2022 to co-create a comprehensive application for seeking funding under the prestigious Erasmus+ project of the European Commission. The application was successfully submitted by the consortium on 15th February 2022. The results of the same are expected to be declared in the month of June or July 2022.

3.2 Network for Business Sustainability- Community for Sustainable Centres

The Network for Business Sustainability (NBS) is advancing sustainable development to assure prosperity for all, today and into the future. By integrating academic research with practical experience, NBS members are mobilizing businesses to contribute to thriving communities and ecosystems. CESD was formally introduced to the SCC members in February 2022.

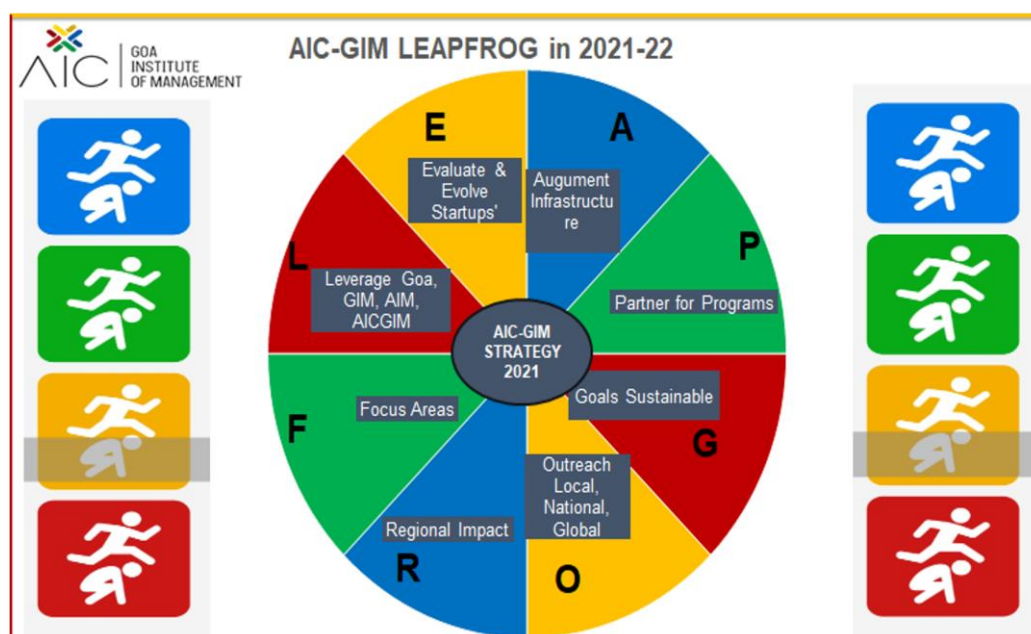
3.3 Project on Landscaping of SDG Training in India

This project was on discovering the role of government and private training institutes in localizing the SDGs In India. This project was funded by the *German Development Institute* and Prof. Avik Sinha from CESD was a core member of the team. The objective of this project was to explore and map the SDG training landscape for government officials in India. A major contribution of the project was to help India develop an evidence-based policy on SDG training.

ATAL INCUBATION CENTRE – GOA INSTITUTE OF MANAGEMENT (AIC-GIM)

Since Dec 2018 to Dec 2021 AIC GIM Foundation has incubated over 40 Startups. The incubated startups are offered an environment that suits their need, we do so by providing incubation support in 3 ways:

- Physical Incubation (State of the art incubation facility at Goa Institute of Management)
- Virtual Incubation (Providing support to startups not based in Goa)
- On-Demand Incubation (Incubation support as and when the startups require) The team at AIC GIM led by Mr. Rajesh Joshi has adopted a LEAPFROG strategy to promote entrepreneurship in various sectors of the startup ecosystem.



Building a better startup ecosystem... a better startup world!

AIC GIM Foundation providing consultation as the Startup Promotion Cell for the Department of Information and Technology, Government of Goa and Infotech Corporation of Goa Ltd. carried out due diligence and has facilitated the disbursement of funds towards incentives to the certified startups. Rs 98 lakhs + funds were disbursed to 20+ Goa Startups. We conducted and organized many workshops, programs and events

AIC-GIM Foundation organised a marquee Startup Conclave and Entrepreneurship summit at Goa called Antha Prerna in 2021. The entire Startup Ecosystem stakeholders of India including Government & Industry converged at Goa in the month of August, September 2021 for the same. Antha Prerna will be held every year and is AIC-GIM flagship event.

Along with AnthaPrerna, WISE: Week of Investments, Startups, Entrepreneurs week was conducted to enable funding in Startups across India. Horses Stable- Bharat's First Funding Show was shot during the WISE Week. More than 300+ Startups were curated and 40+ participated in WISE week and 6 Startups raised about Rs.120 Million.

ESG Startup week was organised in October 2021 to build an Ecosystem for Startups in the Environment, Climate, Social Impact and Governance sectors in Goa. Climathon Panaji was organised during this week to help Panaji find Data Analytics Solutions to help mitigate, assess and build resilience to Climate Change.

RECIPE: A Culinary Startup Week was organized for Food Entrepreneurs and Startups in the culinary and kitchen space. More than 40 Foodpreneurs participated in RECIPE- A Culinary startup Week. Beach Carnival was organised during this week to give platform to Foodpreneurs to showcase their Cuisine.

Mr. Rajesh Joshi (CEO, AIC-GIM Foundation) is included in the Confederation of Indian Industries (CII), Goa Taskforce on Startup & Innovation. We enabled the Virtual Startup Conference and Exhibition for CII.

AIC-GIM Foundation is one of the Selected Incubators to disburse Startup India Seed Funds to Startups up to 20 Lakhs as Grant and up to 50 Lakhs as Venture debt/Compulsory convertible debenture. A total of Rs 2.80 Cr has been sanctioned.

To augment infrastructure, AIC-GIM Foundation launched two sector focused Incubators in Goa

FIERCE KITCHENS, a collaboration between Kamaxi College of Culinary Arts (KCCA) and Atal incubation Centre at Goa Institute of Management (AIC-GIM) offers one of the first culinary incubators in India boasting a world-class infrastructure, cloud kitchen, access to mentors, domain experts and investors. FIERCE KITCHENS successfully completed the first cohort of 12 Foodpreneurs from across India which are now continuing their culinary venture forward.

FIERCE KITCHENS participated in the Global Event "Dubai Expo 2020" as part of the Goa Showcase at the India Pavillion, where we showcased foodpreneurs and our various initiatives to support them.

Hub-CE @ Goa is a collaboration between Atal Incubation Centre at Goa Institute of Management (AIC-GIM) Foundation and Climate Collective Foundation (CCF). Hub-CE @ Goa is India's first dedicated centre for promoting Collaboration & Entrepreneurship in the Climate & Environment sector.

AIC GIM also runs long running marathon outreach events like

INVEST-a-THONS: For investors to view startups as a viable investment option

MEET-a-THONS: Connecting ecosystem players

MATCH-a-THONS: Acetalizing event for startups, Industry and government to gain exposure of each other's capabilities and needs

COLLAB-a-THONS: Creating an environment for all ecosystem enablers to collaborate

With a power generating capacity of **675 kW**, GIM meets 30% of its power needs. The facility boasts to be the largest one in the state. The solar cells installed are of the monocrystalline variety that ensures a better solar energy conversion and utilises a lesser roof area.
