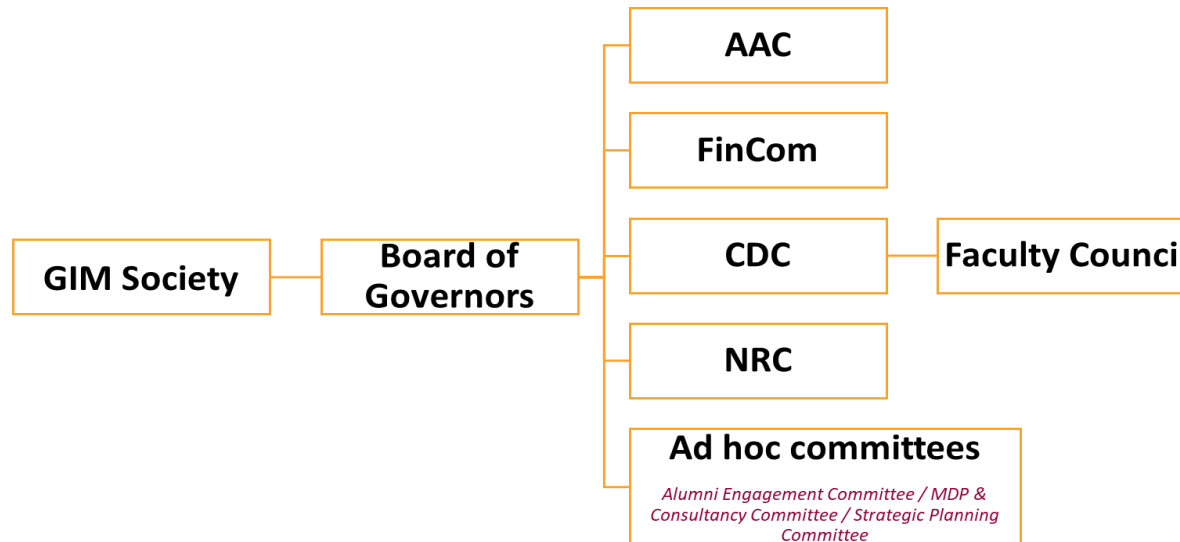

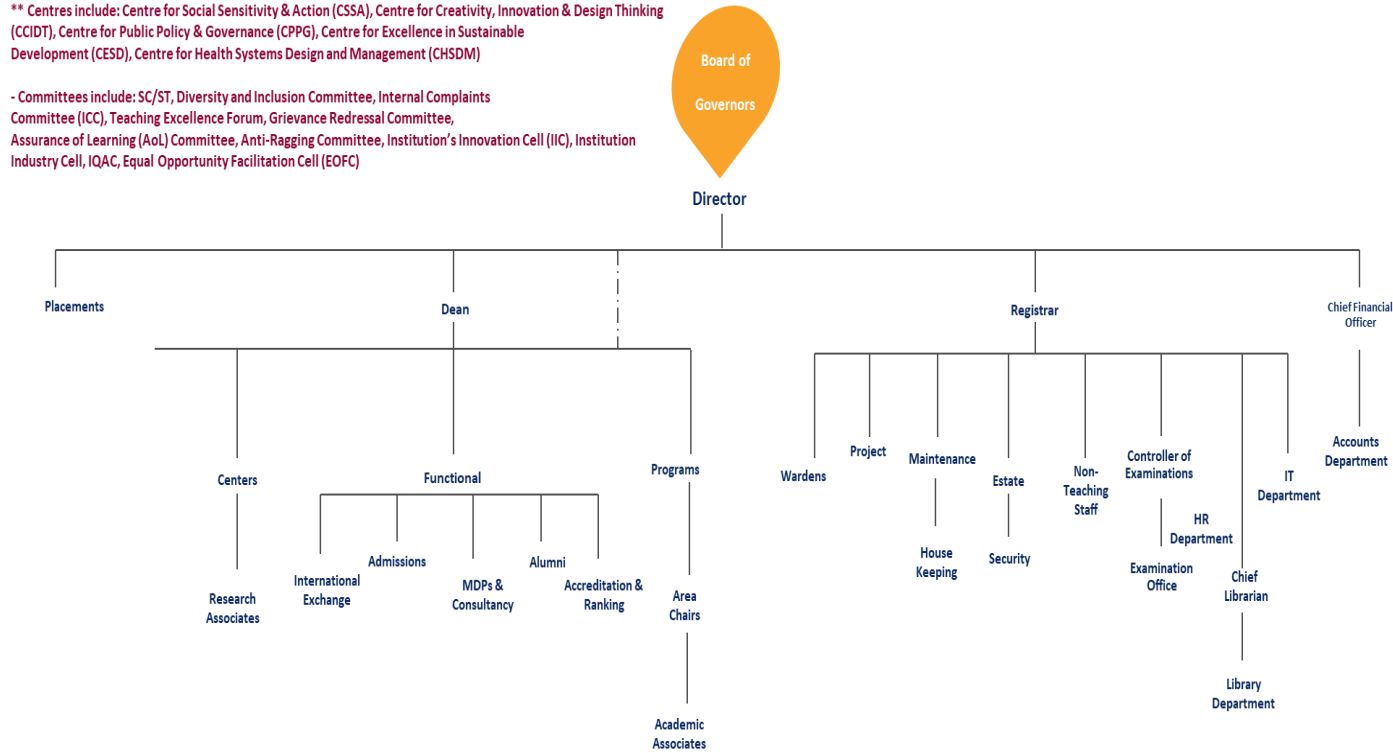

Vi)Online Examination Facility Numbers of Nodes, Internet band width etc

The online examination facility for conducting online examinations for the Hybrid Program is on the Mercer Mettl platform. 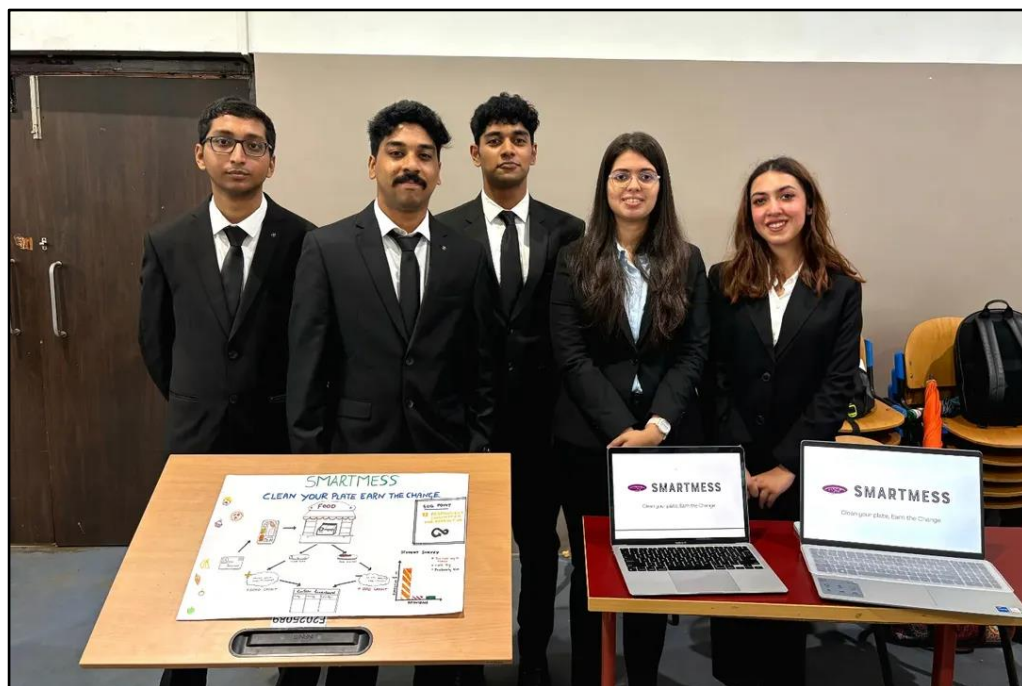

1. Overview

Atal Incubation Centre, Goa Institute of Management (AIC-GIM Foundation) is a sector-agnostic startup incubator established in 2018 and supported by the Atal Innovation Mission, NITI Aayog. Located on the GIM campus at Sanquelim, AIC-GIM serves as the Institute's innovation and entrepreneurship arm, providing incubation, mentorship, funding support, capacity building and industry connections to early-stage ventures, while giving GIM students and faculty direct and structured exposure to live entrepreneurial practice. As an official implementation partner for the Startup India Seed Fund Scheme and MeitY SAMRIDH, and as the State's leading Atal Incubation Centre, AIC-GIM supports entrepreneurs from idea validation through to market growth and anchors Goa's institutional startup ecosystem.

3. Contribution to the Institute's Academic and Innovation Ecosystem

Experiential learning for students: AIC-GIM brings live entrepreneurial practice onto the GIM campus. During the year it conducted entrepreneurship awareness sessions for GIM students, introducing them to startup opportunities and the incubation process, and hosted sessions by portfolio founders who shared their

experience of building ventures. Students are further exposed to practice through pitch events, demo days and through hackathons / startup competitions at which AIC-GIM mentors and evaluates participating ventures.

Industry and institutional interaction: Twenty-three industry collaborations and MoUs, a 36-member mentor panel and a network of twenty institutional investors, venture funds and angel syndicates give the Institute a standing interface with industry and the investment community. AIC-GIM hosted institutional and international delegations, including ENEA, SNATIKA and Mondragon University, Spain and serves as an implementation partner for the Women Entrepreneurship Platform of NITI Aayog and for the Canadian Embassy's AI and Digital Readiness programme, extending that interface beyond the region.

Infrastructure available on campus: A dedicated 10,000 sq ft incubation facility with 55 workstations, discussion and conference rooms, privacy booths and a presentation and workshop area supports incubated ventures and student innovators, alongside shared access to the Institute's library, business research databases and administrative infrastructure.

4. Government Programmes Implemented

AIC-GIM has implemented four central government programmes with a clean utilisation record, together worth approximately Rs 10.7 crore since inception: the Atal Innovation Mission core grant, the Startup India Seed Fund Scheme of DPIIT, and MeitY SAMRIDH 1.0 and 2.0. During 2025-26, SISFS facilitated cumulative seed funding of Rs 86 lakh across five startups, and SAMRIDH 2.0 facilitated cumulative funding of Rs 1.29 crore across four startups. The WE-Nurture ATR Programme was delivered in collaboration with the Women Entrepreneurship Platform of NITI Aayog.

5. Activities Undertaken during 2025-26

2. Institutional and International Delegation Visits: Hosted institutional and international delegations, including ENEA, SNATIKA and Mondragon University, Spain, showcasing AIC-GIM's incubation ecosystem, facilities and startup support initiatives.
3. Startup Competitions, Pitching and Innovation Challenges: Mentored, evaluated and judged startups participating in the Sustainability Challenge, Converge, Fintech Competitions and the Goa Open Innovation Challenge.
4. National Startup Ecosystem Engagement: Represented AIC-GIM at major ecosystem events including MeitY PRAVAAH, TIECON Mumbai, CII Goa Annual Meet and the GCCI Sustainability Conclave, strengthening collaborations and promoting entrepreneurship.

5. Faculty Development and Institutional Capacity Building: Conducted Faculty Development Programmes and contributed to institutional innovation initiatives, including the Ministry of Education Action Plan Workshop.
6. Women Entrepreneurship Initiatives: Organised and supported women-focused entrepreneurship programmes, including WE-Win 2025 and the Women Entrepreneurship Development Programme.
7. AIC-GIM and 18Startup Pre-Incubation Programme: Launched the pre-incubation programme providing structured mentoring, business validation and business development support to 20 aspiring entrepreneurs and early-stage startups.
8. WE-Nurture ATR Programme with the Women Entrepreneurship Platform: Implemented the WE-Nurture ATR Programme in collaboration with WEP, NITI Aayog, supporting 26 women entrepreneurs from across India through structured mentoring, business validation and capacity building.
9. SAMRIDH 2.0 Accelerator Programme: Implemented a three-month accelerator for 6 high-potential startups, providing intensive mentoring from industry experts, entrepreneurs, investors, legal professionals and domain specialists.
10. Founder Networking and Community Building: Organised Founders Club Meetups to facilitate peer learning, networking, collaboration and knowledge sharing among startup founders.
11. Entrepreneurship Sessions for Students and Professionals: Conducted entrepreneurship awareness sessions for GIM students, Army personnel, commerce students, technical students and vocational learners, introducing them to startup opportunities and incubation support.
12. Founder Leadership and Personal Development Series: Organised expert-led sessions covering founder leadership, managing uncertainty, personal branding, founder conflict resolution, leadership communication and strategic visibility.

14. Funding and Investment Readiness Series: Delivered expert sessions on startup funding, investor readiness, founder agreements, intellectual property, ESOPs, fundraising strategies and investment readiness.
15. Startup Compliance and Governance Series: Organised a five-session Compliance-by-Design programme covering governance, data privacy, financial compliance, employment policies, statutory requirements and investor readiness.
16. PACE Idea Validation Programme: Mentored 10 startup founders through structured group mentoring on customer discovery, competitor analysis, MVP development, go-to-market strategies, storytelling and pitch deck preparation.

17. AI and Digital Readiness Workshop: Organised the AI and Digital Readiness Workshop in collaboration with the Canadian Embassy, enabling 15 women entrepreneurs to strengthen AI adoption capabilities and digital readiness for business growth.
